1905 Cornerstone

When the first part of the present First Christian Church building was constructed in 1923, the old building, located at Grand and Fifth, was sold to Rollo E. Reedy.

Reedy used the lumber from the former building to construct a duplex at 819 West Broadway sometime between 1923 and 1925, according to church records.

Later when new owners of that duplex were remodeling, they found the cornerstone from the old church in the foundation. It carried the date 1905. The cornerstone was given to Arthur L. Golay Jr. (Maxine Golay Schneider's brother), a member of the congregation, who lived across the street from the duplex. He had it in his yard until the church celebrated its 90th birthday. At that time, he gave it to the church. The 1905 cornerstone was mounted on a base at the office entry to the church building on Fifth Street.

On the top it has a plaque with this inscription: "This cornerstone was laid in 1905 when the little frame building, was moved from Third and Central to Fifth and Grand. The church was enlarged, redecorated and a spire was added. The Rev. R. H. Lowe was pastor." It was at this time the Central Avenue Church was renamed The First Christian Church.

On the base is a plate with these words: "The cornerstone restored in memory of Harry E. McAnulty 1896-1983 who came to Ponca City the year the cornerstone was laid. He held membership here 1914-83." -Becky Helems
